Purpose of Report

Summary of Findings



Economic Impact, Explained

- Direct expenditures include annual research and operating expenditures, capital investments, student/visitor spending, and alumni wage premium
- Multiplier effect:
 - From labor income spent back into the regional economy
 - From business opportunities for vendors in the region
- Immediate impact from following the dollars spent vs. broader impact from the work itself





Summary of Findings

Statewide Economic Impact

- \$2.9 billion annual total economic impact from annual research and operating expenditures, annualized capital investments, ancillary spending, and alumni wage premium.
- **14,700** full-time equivalent (FTE) jobs supported.
- \$150 million generated in total annual tax revenue to the State of New Jersey.



A Valuable Investment

In FY2023, Rowan received about **\$247 million** in funding from the State of New Jersey.

Because of all the ways the University leverages those dollars with funds from other sources, and because of all the ways the University generates economic activity in the state, that funding has a significant multiplier effect throughout the state economy.

At a current annual statewide economic impact of **\$2.9 billion**, every dollar invested in Rowan by the State is producing almost **\$12** of economic activity within the state.

Annual Research and Operating Expenditures Footprint

- Key Regional Player: Rowan is a major employer and procurer of regional goods and services.
- Economic Multiplier: Employee earnings cycle back into the local economy, further enhanced by the university's engagement with regional suppliers.
- **Direct vs. Indirect Impact:** While direct benefits stem from research and operating expenditures, the university's broader contributions to education, scholarship, research, innovation, and service resonate throughout the region.

Economic Impact from Capital Investments

- **Diverse Capital Initiatives:** Rowan's capital investments span new construction, major renovations, and large-scale maintenance projects. It is estimated that an annual average of **\$108 million** will be invested in capital projects from FY 2022 to 2026.
- Boost to Construction and Related Sectors: Rowan's infrastructural undertakings bolster
 the construction industry, as well as other affiliated sectors, setting off a ripple effect in
 the regional economy.
- Immediate vs. Long-Term Benefits: Direct economic benefits arise from immediate construction expenditures, whereas the broader impact stems from the enhancement of spaces that foster pivotal educational and research activities.

Economic Impact from Student/Visitor Spending

- Estimation and Impact: Calculated by combining student/visitor numbers with typical spending patterns, this influx supports local businesses and boosts regional tax revenues.
- **Diverse Spending Sources for the Local Area:** Spending spans in-person students and a wide range of visitors for athletic, performing arts, and other community events.
- Less Tangible Influences: Beyond direct economic stimulus, increased visitation and spending to Rowan campuses contribute to the long-term vibrance of the local community.

Economic Impact from Alumni Wage Premium

- Higher Earnings: Education and credentials from Rowan equate to elevated earning power for alumni.
- Local Economic Boost: Rowan alumni in the region possess higher spending power, stimulating the local economy and counties, enriching the state of New Jersey's income tax base.
- **Community Impact:** Long-term influence of their occupational and civic contributions to the region.

- Institutional Mission and Societal Impact: Rowan's institutional mission is to provide valuable educational pathways and practical applications of knowledge, driving positive societal change.






Projected Economic Impact of Aspirational Growth

Growth in Return-on-Investment Terms

Should Rowan achieve its multifaceted aspirational growth goals, the university will:

- Generate nearly \$3.6 billion in total economic impact within Gloucester and Camden counties, supporting approximately 18,500 jobs with \$1.4 billion in earnings.
- Contribute over \$4.3 billion in total economic impact within South Jersey, supporting 22,100 jobs with nearly \$1.6 billion in employee compensation.
- Create around \$4.8 billion in total economic impact across New Jersey, supporting 24,200 jobs with about \$1.8 billion in employee compensation.

The successful achievement of Rowan University's 10-year goals is expected to result in a comprehensive ROI, reflecting the university's ambitious growth while offering compelling opportunities for those looking to be part of its economic and strategic advancements.
