The Making a Difference in Real-World Bioethics Dilemmas program supports research to help resolve important emerging **bioethics** problems in clinical, biomedical and public health decision-making practice. Priority topics include **trust in science, medicine, and public health; Bias and discrimination in health care**, which may be based on a broad range of characteristics; **Public health crises**, including their impact on **mental health; Healthcare access**, costs, and resource allocation; and Recent changes to the **federal health and biomedical science** policy and funding landscape.

Small-scale refers to table-top size experiments that would fit into a typical university physics research lab. PIs must submit an idea for consideration for any funding that will be available.

The award is open to applications focusing on any disease or topic within the umbrella of pediatrics and offering practical solutions to such problems, which typically have broad applicability and low barriers to implementation.

In the cybersecurity space, the fund supports technical research on frontier AI systems to include, realistic evaluations of AI cyberoffense, Uplift Studies in cybersecurity context, Interdisciplinary testing to include social engineering and phishing attacks, and forecasting studies.

In the biosecurity space, the fund supports research into evaluations for evasion and obfuscation, biodesign tools risk assessment, biological misuse, pathogen acquisition, and unlearning hazardous information

Areas of focus include: Vulvovaginal Pain Disorders; Impact of Perimenopause and Menopause on Sexual Health; Intimacy-Related Sexual Dysfunction After Cancer Treatment; Libido and Sexual Desire; Female Genital Mutilation; LGBTQIA Health; Endometriosis; and Pelvic Pain.

Investigators must be appointed to the level of Assistant Professor and cannot have held such a position for more than five years.
