This is not a presentation just about Title IX and sports, but about sexual assault, prevention, holding administration, students and universities accountable.</p>	<p>Transgender Students’ Rights Under Title IX <i>Rhasheda Douglas, Rutgers University</i> Room 129, CSC</p> <p>This workshop will discuss how Title IX applies to discrimination and harassment targeted at members of the LGBTQIA+ community. A study by the Southern Poverty Law Center indicates that there has been a rise in reports of hate crimes across the country since the presidential election, and many of those incidents have occurred on college campuses. Therefore, it is even more important for college students to understand their rights to be free from harassment and discrimination.</p>	<p>Social Media & Identity <i>Vicki Vander Brink, & Bri Ozalas, Rowan University</i> Room 127, CSC</p> <p>This is a discussion regarding the ways in which social media and identity affect one another. This workshop will cover various topics including culture, gender, religion, sexuality/sexual orientation, family values, and so on. All of these are aspects of individuals’ identities and influence how they use social media. This group discussion will shed light on the different perspectives and experiences regarding this topic and ultimately allow participants to gain an understanding of the differences in people’s lives.</p>

This workshop will highlight the common statistics and facts that surround male sexual assault victims and how society hurts them during the healing process.</p>	<p>Boys On Film: Toxic Masculinity in the Media <i>Alex Phillips, Rowan University</i> Room 127, CSC</p> <p>This is a presentation about modern day toxic masculinity and how it is perpetuated by the media, including television, social media, and news journalism. This presentation takes an intersectional approach when discussing the issue, and explores subtopics such as marginalized masculinity, rape culture, and male entitlement.
