Introducing Rowan's new Art Gallery & Academic space

Rowan opens 301 West High Street featuring a new gallery & academic space for Public Relations & Advertising. Rowan bought the building in 2013 for \$440,000 and spent more than \$6 million designing and reconstructing it inside and out.

The three-story, 15,000+ square foot building features a beautiful new University Art Gallery and is the new home to the Department of Public Relations & Advertising within the College of Communication & Creative Arts (CCCA). It also features classrooms, faculty offices, computer labs and student lounge spaces.

The property has won a prestigious design award, Outstanding Project 2016 from *Learning by Design*, an architecture magazine. Among the building's most striking features is a wall of glass that rises from street level above the roofline and showcases the building's stairwell. The stairwell is lighted at night, as is a distinctive Rowan torch emblem on the building's High Street side that adds to the borough's developing cityscape and helps build a sense of place.

The new building is about one block from Rowan Boulevard, a \$300 million private investment that is transforming the downtown of Glassboro. It serves as an anchor on the west end of a budding Arts & Entertainment district.
