## **Plastic RMW Bin Guidelines**

## IMPORTANT: NO LOOSE SHARPS MAY BE DIRECTLY PLACED INTO THIS CONTAINER!

Reusable Regulated Medical Waste bins are an alternative option for laboratories using cardboard RMW boxes. Properly tied red bags as well as securely latched sharps containers may be placed directly into these bins. No loose/uncontained waste is permitted. Close lid flaps when not actively adding waste. <u>Do not overfill</u>; lid must fully latch closed to ship for disposal.
