• The Bail Project

The Bail Project National Revolving Bail Fund is on a mission to combat mass incarceration and reshape the pretrial system in the United States. 100% of online donations are used to bring people home. Since bail money comes back to us when cases close, we're able to recycle every dollar donated at least twice per year.

• Black Lives Matter

 A global organization in the US, UK, and Canada, whose mission is to eradicate white supremacy and build local power to intervene in violence inflicted on Black communities by the state and vigilantes.

• A National Collection of Bail Funds

Bail funds are charitable organizations that collect money to pay for the release of people
who have been arrested as they await trial. Around 450,000 people who have not been
convicted of a crime remain in jail each day in the U.S. because they cannot afford to pay
bail, according to the ACLU

• Black Visions Collective

o believes in a future where all Black people have autonomy, safety is community-led, and we are in the right relationship within our ecosystems.

• Campaign Zero

 Funds donated to Campaign Zero support the analysis of policing practices across the country, research to identify effective solutions to end police violence, technical assistance to organizers leading police accountability campaigns and the development of model legislation and advocacy to end police violence nationwide.

• The Innocence Project

 The Innocence Project, founded in 1992 by Peter Neufeld and Barry Scheck at Cardozo School of Law, exonerates the wrongly convicted through DNA testing and reforms the criminal justice system to prevent future injustice.
