Students must be nominated by their Home University before submitting an Exchange application. Nominations should be emailed to **tessler@rowan.edu** and **RowanIC@rowan.edu**.

After nomination, students must submit the <u>J-1 Exchange Student Application</u> with all required documents. Exchange students will receive information regarding the J-1 visa process, housing, and orientation after admission.

Required Documents

During the online application process, students will need to upload the following documents:

- Current college/university transcript
- Copy of passport picture page
- Partner school nomination letter
- English Language Proficiency Test

Language Requirements

Exchange Students must show proof of English language proficiency by meeting one of the following:

- 1. Duolingo: minimum score of 110
- 2. TOEFL iBT: minimum score of 70 (MyBest Scores are accepted)
- 3. IELTS: minimum score of 6.0
- **4. PTE**: minimum score of 50

Students must submit English proficiency test scores unless they are exempt. View our **English Language Policy** for a list of exemptions.

Restrictions	Graduate, doctoral, professional courses (MD, DO, DVM). Exchange students are subject to any enrollment caps or prerequisites for individual classes. For classes with prerequisites, student are responsible for contacting the professor directly to see if the prerequisite requirement may be waived.	
Credit System	Most courses are worth 3 credits; labs are 4 credits

Normal Course Load	12-15 credits per semester 24-30 credits for the full academic year	
Choosing Courses	After completing the application process, exchange students will be able to select their courses. Semester course offerings are available through Rowan University's Section Tally . Exchange students must meet any prerequisites required for individual courses, and in some cases may be asked to provide past course syllabi in order to register for classes with prerequisites. To support students through this process, Rowan provides a dedicated academic advisor, Beth Rey, who helps exchange students select their courses. She can be contacted at rey@rowan.edu.	
Method of Assessment	Assessment per course varies and will be detailed on each course syllabus provided to the student at the start of each semester. Most professors provide their own course assessment tool.	
Official Transcript	At the end of the period of study, students should request an official transcript from Rowan University. There will be a charge for this service. https://sites.rowan.edu/registrar/transcripts/request-rowan-transcript.html
