2026.06.01 APPROVAL OF INTERIM OPERATING BUDGET 2026-2027

Summary Statement: This resolution approves the attached three-month interim operating budget for the period of July 2026 through September 2026 for FY27 which includes expected funding from the State of New Jersey of \$44,875,250 in state-paid fringe benefits and incorporates the General State Appropriation levels as outlined in the Governor’s FY27 Budget Address.

2026.06.02 APPROVAL OF A TOTAL PROJECT BUDGET FOR DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION SERVICES FOR THE STABILIZATION AND REPAIR OF THE CAMDEN ACADEMIC BUILDING FAÇADE

Summary Statement: This resolution approves a total project budget for the Camden Academic Building Façade Project in an amount not to exceed \$1,800,000 for additional repair and restoration work to ensure the long-term safety and integrity of the building envelope.

Summary Statement: In order for CMSRU to provide appropriate external security for its students, faculty, and staff on the Health Sciences Campus in Camden, New Jersey, the Camden County Office of the Sheriff is able to provide staffing of off-duty sheriff's officers. Officers will utilize the command and control structure of the Camden County Office of the Sheriff. Operational staffing will be determined through discussions with the Camden County Office of the Sheriff, Rowan University Public Safety personnel, and the Associate Dean for Finance, Administration, and Operations at CMSRU. The cost of services will not exceed \$1,000,000 for FY27.
- 2026.06.05** APPROVAL OF PROFESSIONAL LEGAL SERVICES – POOL LIST
Summary Statement: This resolution authorizes the award of contracts for legal services with professional legal service providers.

Summary Statement: This resolution approves a contract without competitive bidding with MBI for consulting services in the area of government affairs. Funds to pay for this service shall be paid from the discretionary fund of the Rowan University Foundation.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the New Jersey Medical and Health Sciences Education Restructuring Act, the Board of Trustees has been empowered to direct and control expenditures and transfers of funds appropriated to the University as well as tuition received by the University, N.J.S.A. 18A:64M-9(e), provided such activities are conducted in accordance with the provisions of the State budget and appropriation acts of the Legislature, reporting changes and additions thereto and transfers thereof to the Director of the Division of Budget and Accounting in the State Department of the Treasury, and

WHEREAS, the Board is also empowered with respect to funds received from other sources, to direct and control expenditures and transfers in accordance with the terms of any applicable trusts, gifts, bequests or other special provisions, and

WHEREAS, all accounts of the University are subject to audit by the State at any time, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the uncertainty of State appropriations for FY27, the University's operating budget is expected to face a significant economic impact, the full extent of which remains unclear at the time of this Board of Trustees meeting, and

WHEREAS, the University has proposed the attached three-month operating budget for the period of July 2026 through September 2026 in FY27 in the amount of \$211,743,809 including regular operating, auxiliary operations, division of Rowan Global, Cooper Medical School of Rowan University, Virtua Health College, and Shreiber School of Veterinary Medicine, and

WHEREAS, sufficient funding has been identified in the attached proposed interim operating budget to support the recommended expenditures

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees of Rowan University approves the attached three-month interim operating budget of \$211,743,809 for the period of July 2026 through September 2026 for FY27.

APPROVAL OF A TOTAL PROJECT BUDGET FOR DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION SERVICES FOR THE STABILIZATION AND REPAIR OF THE CAMDEN ACADEMIC BUILDING FAÇADE

WHEREAS, pursuant to the New Jersey Medical and Health Sciences Education Restructuring Act (“Restructuring Act”), the Board of Trustees has been empowered to direct and control expenditures and supervise the construction and demolition of buildings and projects, N.J.S.A 18A:64M-9(f) and (r), and

WHEREAS, Rowan University (“Rowan”) owns and operates the Camden Academic Building located in Camden, and

WHEREAS, Rowan identified a condition in need of remediation at the Camden Academic Building when portions of the exterior brick façade became loose and detached from the building, and

WHEREAS, due to the threat posed by the deteriorating façade conditions, an emergency declaration was issued to authorize immediate stabilization measures necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of students, faculty, staff and the public, and

WHEREAS, Rowan engaged professional consultants to perform emergency stabilization work and conduct investigative assessments to determine the extent of the façade deterioration and identify the repairs necessary to restore the building envelope and ensure the long-term integrity of the structure, and

WHEREAS, based upon the findings of these investigations, it has been determined that additional design, engineering and construction services are required to complete the stabilization, repair and restoration of the Camden Academic Building façade, and

WHEREAS, Rowan has determined that the cost associated with this work shall not exceed \$1,800,000, and

WHEREAS, the Senior Vice President for Finance and Chief Financial Officer has certified that sufficient funds are available to support the costs associated with the project.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees that the total project budget for the design, engineering, stabilization and construction activities necessary to repair the façade conditions at the Camden Academic Building is approved in an amount not to exceed \$1,800,000.

**APPROVAL OF MARKETING CAMPAIGN AND CONTINUING A
CONTRACT WITH OLOGIE**

WHEREAS, pursuant to the New Jersey Medical and Health Sciences Education Restructuring Act (“Restructuring Act”), the Board of Trustees has been empowered to direct and control expenditures under N.J.S.A 18A:64M-9(f), and

WHEREAS, Rowan University (“Rowan”) has determined that a marketing and branding campaign to ensure brand recognition and to clearly articulate the university’s identity and story is critical to introduce the university to national audiences and beyond, and

WHEREAS, Rowan requested proposals for leaders in the marketing and branding industry capable of providing consulting expertise and following that process identified Ologie of Columbus, Ohio, as a partner for the creative development essential to the campaign as well as ongoing assistance in the execution of the branding and marketing strategy, and

WHEREAS, Rowan has determined that continued engagement with Ologie given the firm’s expertise in higher education and its successful efforts to support Rowan’s campaign thus far is advisable and in accordance with the University’s goals, and

WHEREAS, the total cost for the contract will not exceed \$6,100,000 for FY27, and

WHEREAS, the Senior Vice President for Finance and Chief Financial Officer anticipates that there will be sufficient budgeted funds available to support this project in the pending FY27 budget

**AUTHORIZATION TO ACQUIRE ALL ASSETS OF
NERD STREET GAMERS, LLC**

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Medical and Health Sciences Education Restructuring Act, N.J.S.A.18A:64M-1 et seq. ("Restructuring Act"), permits Rowan University, a public research university, to enter into agreements for the procurement of services without public advertising pursuant to applicable state law as outlined in N.J.S.A. 18A:64-56; and

WHEREAS, Nerd Street Gamers, LLC ("Nerd Street"), entered into a Lease Agreement, dated as of July 1, 2021 ("Lease"), with Glassboro A-3 Victoria Urban Renewal, LLC, as landlord ("Landlord") for 7,203 rentable square feet of space with the street address of 109 West High Street, located on Block 18.03, Lot 1 in the Borough of Glassboro, County of Gloucester, State of New Jersey ("Facility") the term of which lease expires on February 28, 2027; and

WHEREAS, Rowan University entered into an agreement with Nerd Street, dated February 24, 2020, as amended and restated to date (as amended and restated, the "Agreement"), pursuant to which Nerd Street: (i) equipped the Facility including, but not limited to, a studio and control room, each meeting certain specifications as set forth in the Agreement; and (ii) developed and implemented courses and certificates for Rowan University Students with an emphasis on the esports industry; and

WHEREAS, on February 18, 2026 the Superior Court of New Jersey, Law Division, Mercer County entered final judgement for money damages and judgment for possession against Nerd Street in favor of its creditor, the Bank of Princeton ("Default"); and

WHEREAS, in response to the Default, Rowan University entered into discussions with Nerd Street for the acquisition of all of Nerd Street's assets located at the Facility, as further described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto (collectively the "Assets"), for an amount not to exceed \$450,000; and

WHEREAS, Rowan University's administrators and faculty have conducted appropriate due diligence and have determined that the University has the capability of taking over management and operation of the esports courses and certification programs as well as the facility; and

WHEREAS, in order to timely secure the Assets and avoid disruption to ongoing esports planning and program development, Rowan University has determined that it is in its best interests to acquire the Assets for an amount not to exceed \$450,000 ("Esports Acquisition"); and

WHEREAS, in connection with the Esports Acquisition, Rowan must enter into: (i) one or more agreements with Nerd Street including, but not limited to, an Asset Purchase Agreement; and (ii) an agreement with the Landlord to assume the remaining term of the Lease (collectively, the “Transaction Documents”); and

WHEREAS, the Senior Vice President for Finance and Chief Financial Officer determined that there will be sufficient budgeted funds available to pay the costs of the Esports Acquisition.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED the Rowan University Board of Trustees hereby authorizes the acquisition of all of the Assets from Nerd Street for an amount not to exceed \$450,000 and authorizes the Senior Vice President for Finance and Chief Financial Officer, or his designee, to negotiate, execute, and deliver all agreements, instruments, and documents necessary or appropriate to effectuate the acquisition including, but not limited to the Transaction Documents.

SUMMARY STATEMENT/RATIONALE

This resolution authorizes the acquisition of all Nerd Street Gamers’ assets located at 109 West High Street for an amount not to exceed \$450,000 and the execution of all agreements, instruments, and documents necessary or appropriate to effectuate the acquisition.

WHEREAS, the University undertook design, development and construction of the Jean and Ric Edelman Fossil Park and the project has now been completed, resulting in world class facility focused on education about the past with the purpose of encouraging visitors to engage in future actions for the good of the planet, and

WHEREAS, certain claims have been raised by the contractors relating to alleged delay, owner driven change orders, design changes, and other extra-contractual work, and

WHEREAS, the Gloucester County Improvement Authority (“GCIA”), under the project development agreement, advanced certain funds on behalf of Rowan to achieve completion of the project, and

WHEREAS, GCIA is also actively engaged in negotiating resolutions of the above-referenced claims, and

WHEREAS, with such payment, the total project budget for Jean and Ric Edelman Fossil Park is approved in an amount not to exceed \$82,060,000, and

WHEREAS, the Senior Vice President for Finance and Chief Financial Officer has certified that there are sufficient funds available to pay for the costs associated with the activities identified above, and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees that the total project budget for the design, development and construction of the Jean and Ric Edelman Fossil Park is approved in an amount not to exceed \$82,060,000 and
