A hybrid meeting of the Rowan University Board of Trustees was held on September 11, 2024, in the Eynon Ballroom of the Chamberlain Student Center on the Glassboro Campus and via WebEx. Chair Bruner welcomed everyone to the meeting and called the Public Session of the meeting to order at 3:00 p.m.

Chair Bruner asked everyone to stand for the Pledge of Allegiance.

**OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT

Ms. Melissa Wheatcroft read the Open Public Meetings Act Statement.

**INSTALLATION OF NEW BOARD OF

Chair Bruner announced the installation of Mr. Ali Ishage, the new non-voting Student Trustee. Ms. Wheatcroft administered the oath.

The Board members congratulated Mr. Ishage and welcomed him to the Board of Trustees.

**REORGANIZATION OF THE BOARD OF
TRUSTEES FOR 2024-2025**

Chair Bruner turned the meeting over to President Houshmand for the reorganization of the Board of Trustees. President Houshmand asked Mr. Loesch to introduce a motion recommending a slate of officers for the Rowan University Board of Trustees for 2024-2025.

On behalf of the Nominations Committee, Mr. Loesch recommended the following slate of officers for 2024-2025: Chad Bruner, Chair; Larry Salva, Vice Chair; Jean Edelman, Secretary. A motion to close the nominations was made and then seconded. The motion was approved 15-0 in favor. A motion approving the slate of officers was made and seconded. The motion was approved 15-0 in favor. Dr. Houshmand congratulated the new officers.

**COMPLETION OF THE
REORGANIZATION OF THE BOARD OF
TRUSTEES**

Chair Bruner informed the Board of Trustees that there are two resolutions that constitute the completion of the reorganization of the Board of Trustees that will be reviewed individually: Resolution #2024.09.01, Approval of Board of Trustees Calendar For 2024-2025 and Resolution #2024.09.02, Approval of Newspapers for Official Notification Of Board Of Trustees Meetings And Other Required Postings.

**MOTION TO MOVE INTO CLOSED
SESSION**

Chair Bruner entertained a motion and was seconded for the Board of Trustees to move into Closed Session. A vote was taken 15-0 in favor. The first public portion of the meeting closed at 3:12 p.m.

RETURN TO OPEN SESSION

At 3:54 p.m., Chair Bruner stated that Closed Session had concluded, and no formal action was taken. Topics discussed included personnel actions, an update on real estate and the litigation report. Chair Bruner entertained a motion that was seconded for the Board to return to public session. A vote was taken 14-0 in favor to return to public session.

**MOTION TO APPROVE THE MINUTES OF
THE JUNE 19, 2024 BOARD MEETING**

Chair Bruner entertained a motion that was seconded to approve the minutes of the meeting held on June 19, 2024. A vote was taken 14-0 in favor to approve the minutes.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

President Houshmand welcomed everyone back and a special welcome to the largest incoming class of first-year students.

To start with admissions, President Houshmand thanked all for a fantastic fall recruitment effort. Overall applications and deposits for first-time undergraduates and deposits for Rowan Global are at record highs for Fall 2024. Combined first-time first-year and transfer undergraduate deposits for the fall semester stand at 5,321. This total is up 21% compared with last year. Domestic undergraduate first-time first-year deposits are up 30% versus

Fall 2023, driven by growth in out-of-state deposits, which are up 50% versus last year. The University continues to experience growth in our international undergraduate deposits, which are up over 62% versus last year. Overall Global Domestic student deposits for the fall semester of 2024 stand at 1,593. This total is up 5% from 2023. Global graduate deposits, including International, are up 13%. Global undergraduate, combined 3+1 and degree completion, deposits total 797 and are up 10%.

In terms of Advancement and Foundation for Fiscal Year 2024, Rowan's new gifts and commitments totaled \$23.2M exceeding the goal of \$23M. As of September 2, 2024, Rowan's new gifts and commitments for Fiscal Year 2025 total \$2.85M. The University is currently in the fourth year of our comprehensive campaign. Documented new gifts and commitments total \$182.2M. In terms of events, on Saturday, September 28, 2024 the season opening celebration of the Marie Rader series kicks off with a performance from world-renowned pianist Mikhail Voskresensky, and Saturday, November 2, 2024 is the University's annual Homecoming celebration.

Regarding facilities and infrastructure, construction continues on the Shreiber School of Veterinary Medicine and Virtua Health College of Medicine and Life Science Research Center. Steel erection is nearly complete and a beam signing ceremony occurred on September 9, 2024. Our student athletes have been practicing on the new turf field and track with the recent completion of The Richard Wackar Stadium Field and Track Replacement Project. The University looks forward to seeing our athletes compete this fall. There is a continued focus on improving technology infrastructure, including improving wireless coverage on campus and enhancing the security of our networks. Rowan earned Level I Arboretum Accreditation with ArbNet and continues an interdisciplinary collaboration involving faculty, students, and the Division of Facilities (among others) focusing on environmental education and conservation. The University offers a variety of campus experiences including walking tours intended to encourage engagement with the outdoors for our community and beyond.

Regarding academics and research, annual research expenditures for sponsored programs in FY24 totaled \$63.8M, marking a 14.7% increase from the previous year. Rowan University and IBEW Local 98 announced an agreement to boost career advancement by combining union apprentice training and Rowan's stackable online construction management certificates. Apprentices will work full-time and achieve union training while taking courses online, allowing students to complete their apprenticeship and degree at the same time. The Philadelphia Inquirer recently named Radio, Television, and Film professor Jonathan Olshefski's documentary QUEST among the top 10 documentaries ever made about Philadelphia. QUEST captures eight years in the life of an African American family living in North Philadelphia. QUEST premiered at Sundance Film

Festival and was nominated for a Best Documentary Emmy as well as receiving 15 other awards. Professors Alison Krufka and Claude Krummenacher, with the Department of Biological & Biomedical Sciences, received a five-year, \$1.3M NIH Bridges to the Baccalaureate grant to support students while attending Rowan College of South Jersey (RCSJ) and following their transfer to Rowan University, with the goal of diversifying the biomedical workforce and graduate and health professional programs. Rowan University has been named a FirstGen Forward Network school by the National Student Affairs Administrators in Higher Education for a third year. The FirstGen Forward Network is a national model for enhancing first-generation student success. Rowan University was awarded the Higher Education Excellence in Diversity award for the fourth consecutive year. This national honor recognizes Rowan's outstanding commitment to diversity and inclusion.

Chair Bruner gave a recap of all Committee meetings.

Chair Bruner entertained a motion to approve the Consent Agenda. A vote was taken 15-0 in favor to approve the Consent Agenda.

APPROVAL OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES CALENDAR FOR 2024-2025

WHEREAS, the "Open Public Meetings Act" (Chapter 231, P.L. 1975) requires that "within seven days following an annual organization or reorganization meeting of a public body, every public body shall post and maintain a schedule of regular meetings of the public body to be held during the succeeding year" (C. 10:4-18), and

WHEREAS, the Rowan University Board of Trustees desires to be in full compliance with statutory provisions, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that at all the regularly scheduled meetings of the Board of Trustees listed above (designated as “Regular Meeting”), that the Board is authorized to conduct a closed session addressing issues deemed proper for such discussion beginning at 3:00 p.m. and that the open session of said regular meeting will begin at 4:00 p.m. (or 60 minutes prior to the time of the open meeting if the time of the meeting varies) in the place so designated for such open meeting; that at the beginning of the open session, after the preliminary matters are attended to, the Board Chair or other Board member so acting shall state for the record whether a closed session was held and, in appropriate general terms, the topics covered or discussed in such closed session in the same manner as would be stated prior to such a closed session or state that no closed session was held. Additional closed sessions during or at the end of the open sessions may still be held and normal authorization procedures will apply.

SUMMARY STATEMENT/RATIONALE

This resolution approves the Board of Trustees meeting calendar through December 31, 2025. This resolution provides that the Board of Trustees meetings can start at 3:00 p.m. in closed session with the Open Meeting to begin at 4:00 p.m. (or a similar 60 minute time period prior to the advertised start of a meeting) with appropriate procedures. If there is no closed session, the Open Meeting will begin at 4:00 p.m. The purpose of this provision is to avoid the practice of members of the public wishing to attend the Board’s meetings to be present at the advertised start time and then to sit and wait while the Board typically goes into closed session right at the beginning of the meeting.

APPROVAL OF NEWSPAPERS FOR OFFICIAL NOTIFICATION OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES MEETINGS AND OTHER REQUIRED POSTINGS

WHEREAS, the “Open Public Meetings Act” (Chapter 231, P.L. 1975) requires that “within seven days following an annual organization or reorganization meeting of a public body, every public body shall post and maintain...a schedule of the regular meetings of the public body to be held during the succeeding year” (C. 10:4-18), and

WHEREAS, the Open Public Meetings Act (Chapter 231, P.L. 1975) requires the governing body at the beginning of the year to designate two newspapers in the area to which notices and agendas of the meetings will be transmitted, and

WHEREAS, statutes also require the posting of the meeting schedule on the University website and on the University bulletin boards reserved for these announcements in Bole Hall and the Student Center of the Glassboro campus, the Camden campus building, Cooper Medical School of Rowan University building, and Rowan University School of Osteopathic Medicine Academic Center.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Trustees instructs its Secretary to transmit the schedule of its annual meetings for the 2024-25 year to the *Press of Atlantic City*, the *South Jersey Times*, and the *Courier-Post* and further to post said schedule on the University website and the designated spaces indicated above.

SUMMARY STATEMENT/RATIONALE

The Open Public Meetings Act (Chapter 231, P.L. 1975) requires that public meetings of the Board of Trustees be announced in area newspapers and posted on the University website and other spaces on each campus. This resolution directs the meeting schedule to be posted on the University website and designated campus spaces and authorizes the administration to purchase advertising space in three regional newspapers. The designated papers are the *Press of Atlantic City*, the *South Jersey Times*, and the *Courier-Post*.

- WHEREAS,** the New Jersey Medical and Health Sciences Education Restructuring Act, N.J.S.A.18A:64M-1 et seq. (“Restructuring Act”), permits Rowan University, a public research university, to enter into agreements for the procurement of services without public advertising pursuant to applicable state law as outlined in N.J.S.A. 18A:64-56, and
- WHEREAS,** pursuant to Resolution 2014.02.02 approved by the Board of Trustees at its February 19, 2014 meeting, the Board approved exceptions including an exception for software and data technology through N.J.S.A. 18A:64-56(19), and
- WHEREAS,** Rowan has identified a need for a multi-level Customer Relationship Management Software System (CRM) at the University that allows for the tracking and processing of all potential students, and
- WHEREAS,** Technolutions has a software package that is unique in its analytics, tracking, and multi-media capabilities for student recruitment, and the University has concluded that Technolutions best suits the University’s needs in this area, and
- WHEREAS,** Technolutions has agreed to provide the necessary services in an amount not to exceed \$120,000 for FY25, and
- WHEREAS,** the Senior Vice President for Finance and Chief Financial Officer has certified that there are sufficient funds available to pay the authorized herein
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of Trustees that the Senior Vice President for Finance and Chief Financial Officer is authorized to enter into a contract with Technolutions located in New Haven, Connecticut in an amount not to exceed \$120,000 for FY25 with the option for renewal as necessary for university purposes where funds remain available in the university budget for those purposes and such contracts are determined to be necessary to effectuate the above-described purposes.

SUMMARY STATEMENT/RATIONALE

This resolution approves a contract without competitive bidding with Technolutions in an amount not to exceed \$120,000 to cover CRM services for FY25 and continuing thereafter provided the contracts are determined to be necessary to effectuating university purposes and funds are available to support the contracts in the university budget.

- WHEREAS,** Rowan University has a need to recruit students and wishes to engage Power School for these purposes as Power School has established itself as a leader in providing tools and services to support enrollment activities, and
- WHEREAS,** Rowan has determined that these services will support Rowan’s continuing goal of increasing and enhancing its student body, and
- WHEREAS,** Power School will provide the necessary tools and services for an amount not to exceed \$150,000 for FY25, and
- WHEREAS,** the Senior Vice President for Finance and Chief Financial Officer certifies that there are sufficient funds available to pay the expenses authorized herein

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees that the Senior Vice President for Finance and Chief Financial Officer is authorized to enter into contracts with Power School of Folsam, California, for a total amount not to exceed \$150,000 for FY25 with the option for renewal as necessary for university purposes where funds remain available in the university budget for those purposes and such contracts are determined to be necessary to effectuate the above-described purposes.

SUMMARY STATEMENT/RATIONALE

This resolution approves contracts without competitive bidding with Power School for educational technology and ancillary consulting services relating to recruitment for a total amount not to exceed \$150,000 for FY25 and continuing thereafter provided the contracts are determined to be necessary to effectuating university purposes and funds are available to support the contracts in the university budget.

(“Restructuring Act”), permits Rowan University, a public research university, to enter into agreements for the procurement of services without public advertising pursuant to applicable state law as outlined in N.J.S.A. 18A:64M-9(k), and
- WHEREAS,** pursuant to Resolution 2014.02.02 approved by the Board of Trustees at its February 19, 2014 meeting, the Board approved these exceptions including an exception for consulting services in accordance with N.J.S.A. 18A:64-56(a)(25), and
- WHEREAS,** Rowan University has a need for consulting services to assist Rowan personnel with student support services and direct coaching support intended to improve student enrollment, re-enrollment, retention, and completion through the use of coach and trainer services that are accredited, and
- WHEREAS,** Rowan has determined that these services will support Rowan’s continuing goal of enhancing its student body and supporting its current student population by providing needed supports to students and by enhancing the skills of Rowan staff to provide these services directly, and
- WHEREAS,** Inside Track, d/b/a Strada Education Foundation, is able to provide the services described above for an amount not to exceed \$500,000 for FY25, and
- WHEREAS,** the Senior Vice President for Finance and Chief Financial Officer certifies that there are sufficient funds available to pay the expenses authorized herein

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees that the Senior Vice President for Finance and Chief Financial Officer is authorized to enter into a contract with Inside Track (DBA Strada Education Foundation) of Indianapolis, Indiana, for a total amount not to exceed \$500,000 for FY25 with the option for renewal as necessary for university purposes where funds remain available in the university budget for those purposes and such contracts are determined to be necessary to effectuate the above-described purposes.

SUMMARY STATEMENT/RATIONALE

This resolution approves contracts without competitive bidding with Inside Track (DBA Strada Education Foundation) for educational consulting services relating to recruitment and retention for a total amount not to exceed \$500,000 for FY25 and continuing thereafter provided the contracts are determined to be necessary to effectuating university purposes and funds are available to support the contracts in the university budget.

**APPROVAL OF AGREEMENT OF SUPPORT BETWEEN ROWAN UNIVERSITY AND THE BOROUGH OF
GLASSBORO FOR THE
FUNDING OF THREE FIRE FIGHTERS**

- WHEREAS,** pursuant to the New Jersey Medical and Health Sciences Education Restructuring Act (“Restructuring Act”), Rowan University has been designated as a public research university, and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees that the Senior Vice President for Finance and Chief Financial Officer is authorized to continue agreements with Eastern Revenue of Wayne, Pennsylvania and AR Resources, Inc., of Blue Bell Pennsylvania, for FY25 and amend those agreements to the amounts of \$120,000 from \$75,000 and \$120,000 from \$75,0000 respectively, and

There was no new business.

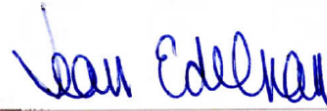
ADJOURNMENT
