3. GMATS—If you plan to go to graduate school after completing your undergraduate degree, please plan to take and study for the GMATs during your senior year.
4. Senior Privilege—If you have 90 credits and at least a 3.0 GPA, you may take one graduate course each semester during your senior year for no extra cost. Please contact your advisor or the RCOB Assistant Dean for Graduate Studies for information.
5. 120 credits must be completed in order to earn your degree. Please be sure to pay attention to your credit total in addition to completing the required courses.
