Crisis Screening Camden County: provides screening and stabilization services to adults and youth experiencing a psychiatric emergency. Call 856-428-HELP before visiting the screening center.

**Coordinated Specialty Care (CSC):** CSC provides in-home and in-community coordinated specialty care for young adults ages 15-35 years old experiencing psychotic symptoms for less than 2 years. The overall goal is to reduce the likelihood of long-term disability and help individuals lead productive, independent lives. Services include psychiatric prescribing, case management, supported employment, peer and recovery support, individual/family therapy and linkage to community resources. **Rutgers University Behavioral Health Care Coordinated Speciality Care/First Episode Psychosis Program:** This program services young people ages 15-35 and their families experiencing their first episode of psychosis. We define a "first episode" as within 2 years of experiencing symptoms such as: Hallucinations, Delusions, Disorganized Speech, Thoughts, and/or Behavior. Treatment is tailored to the needs of the client, but generally, components of treatment include: Psychiatric evaluation, Psychoeducation, Individual therapy, Family therapy, Group therapy, Case management, Supported Employment and Education, Treatment for other mental health challenges or substance use, Family support (individual & group), Medication education/management, Peer Support. Our clinic is located within the Rutgers University Behavioral Health Care system. Both of our clinics serve the following counties: Hunterdon, Mercer, Middlesex, Monmouth, Ocean, Somerset, and Union Counties of New Jersey. Our Contact Information:
